

Read in Week - October 6-10th is Read in Week. We will be emphasizing reading even more than we already do and participating in some fun activities. We'd also like the students to bring in their favorite book and have them share with their classmates the title and why it is their favorite book.

On Wednesday, October 8th we will be having story book character dress up day. I am already making my costume!





Guided Reading groups have already begun. The students have been placed in groups based on their individual level of reading. This will be a time for them to read in a small group and have some more direct reading instruction from the teachers.

Those students who are not with a teacher on a particular day will be reading decodables and working on roll & reads.

Beginning Monday, September 22nd you will see a "Buddy Book Bag" coming home each night. These books are at your child's reading level and they should feel comfortable reading to you. Please build a habit of having your child put the bag and books back into their backpack every evening after completing their reading with you. This is critical as to the success of mastering their reading level for first grade! Doing this will support their learning in school. If these bags become damaged, we will not be able to replace them due to cost, so please treat them like they truly are your "Buddy."

If you are planning to pick up your child from school on any given day instead of letting them take the school bus, please send a note in your child's mail folder that morning. You can imagine that it is difficult to make a split-second decision when the busses are pulling away as to whether to believe your son or daughter that their parent has told them not to take the bus that day. Students often get messages wrong and then we are making calls home to ask if you would please pick up your son or daughter. This just makes it a whole lot stressful for both the students and their teachers.



Students are beginning to wear more layers of clothing to school now. Please make sure that their names are in shoes, as well as outerwear. We have had a few "no named" articles of clothing left behind already.



Please read to your child every night (or listen to them read) to help them love stories! This will make a huge difference as they learn to read! Club 25 was handed out at Parent Literacy Night or sent home with your child the next day.

This month's bible memory is due on October 21st and is Psalm 23:3–4 which says, "He refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me, your rod and your staff, they comfort me." We are encouraging students to add this onto the verse they already know from the month of September, but they will only be tested on Psalm 23:3–4.
